# APPENDIX F. Connections Between the Studio Thinking Framework and the National Core Arts Standards

The Studio Thinking framework is parallel in striking ways to the National Core Arts Standards (National Coalition of Core Arts Standards, 2014). Indeed, *Studio Thinking: The Real Benefits of Visual Art Education* (Hetland et al., 2007) was one of the resources used by the committee that created the standards. We have created a table that provides a "crosswalk" from the National Core Arts Standards for Visual Arts to the Studio Habits of Mind. In using this table, teachers can start from whichever approach is most comfortable and familiar to them—the standards or the Studio Habits. We do not address the Studio Structures in the table, since every structure can be used to address any of the standards.

## **HOW TO READ THE TABLE**

The Artistic Processes and Anchor Standards of the National Core Arts Standards for Visual Arts (NCAS) appear in gray bands extending across the table. The individual NCAS Standards, with their Enduring Understandings and Essential Questions, are listed in the left-hand column. The Studio Habits of Mind that are encompassed by the Enduring Understandings and Essential Questions for each Standard appear in the right-hand column. After each Studio Habit, we list (in italics and parentheses) the corresponding wording from the NCAS Enduring Understandings and Essential Questions.
